All are now adopted or waiting for their forever homes. A big thanks also goes to volunteers who held special fund raisers to raise money for the treatment. Currently Allie is recovering from TPLO surgery and will be ready for her forever home in August. Blossom is a beautiful Golden who has allergies. She is looking for a very special home who will maintain her special diet and understand her environmental allergies.

ASK ELSA



Dear Elsa.

While we were out running, we came across a black and white critter. We were very curious and went to investigate. Unfortunately, this critter was not too happy and sprayed us. We had a terrible smell all over us. Our Mom & Dad were not too happy. Do you have any ideas how to get the smell off? **Cee Cee and Lacey**

Dear Cee Cee and Lacey,

That critter was a skunk. You have to watch out for them, as they spray to protect themselves. I did some research and found this Skunk Tonic on Missouri Conservations web page. I have also heard diluted tomato juice will help remove the smell.

This can be used on people, clothing and pets.

Mix Together

1 quart of hydrogen peroxide

1/4 cup baking soda

1 teaspoon liquid laundry soap or dishwashing detergent

The first two ingredients form an alkaline peroxide that chemically changes the skunk essence into sulfonic acid, an odorless chemical. The soap breaks down the oily skunk essence and makes it more susceptible to the other chemicals.

Keep away from eyes, nose and mouth of people and pets.

Do not store this mixture or put it in a closed container. When kept in a warm place, the mixture may expand and burst the container. Good luck and stay away from skunks.

We have now collected 54,971 toward that milestone.


These pennies will assist our Golden Retrievers, who were strays, who have been rescued from shelters or whose families could no longer care for them.

On April 21st, Saguaro Sandy crossed to the Rainbow Bridge. Sandy had survived mast cell cancer for 3.5 years with only holistic treatments. We will all miss her collecting all the woobies in the house...they *all* belonged to her. The little princess loved to ride in the car. She will be missed. Sandy would have been 12 years old on June 26th.



On April 27th, our beloved Hanover went to the bridge. Hannie was with us for nearly two and a half years and had the sweetest disposition for a Golden we have had. For the last 5 months of his life, he battled with bone cancer, and we tried to keep him as comfortable as possible. He will be missed terribly.



Bernie went to the bridge on April 30th, 2009. He was adopted from LAGR about 5 yrs ago. He had been diagnosed with bone cancer in early February, and while they said it was a slow growing cancer, it grew quickly. He was 95 lbs of lovins, had the true Golden spirit as he never met a stranger and had quite the sweet tooth. He has eaten a dozen or more cinnamon rolls on TWO occasions, a pan of brownies, and 2 bags of chocolate kisses, wrappers and all.....and never once got sick or even flinched! Toward the end, I talked to an animal communicator and learned about how seriously they take their roles in our lives and believe that Bernie was brought into mine for a reason and for a time... it's just sad when that time is up.

Sanford came to our pack July 2007 and was an instant "family" member. He was our foster brother for two months until we convinced our adopted mom and dad that our home should be his forever home. We had him almost two years, but he taught all of us two-legged and four-legged creatures so much in that short time. He was the true patriarch of our family. When our most recent foster came in January, Sanford was the one who really helped him begin to trust people. He was a true Golden and a great companion. He was 15 years and 4 months young. His mind and heart were still full of energy, but his body was not. He went to the bridge on May 25th after everyone in our family told him goodbye. We had you a short time Sanford, but you left a lasting impact on all of our lives!

Anyone who ever met our Twinkie remembered her. She was a vocal, sparkly little diva who was happy to meet everyone! The picture above shows her on the one place she wasn't going to be allowed on—our (at the time) new leather couch. Two years ago, I noticed a bump on Twinkie's back which turned out to be a spindle cell sarcoma. She went through five



rounds of chemotherapy with little effect on her bubbly personality. In April 2008, she was diagnosed with kidney failure and placed on a special diet. This spring, her naps became longer, her walks became shorter, and her appetite disappeared. I knew the extra time we were granted with her was about over. On Tuesday, May 26th, she wagged her tail weakly at me when I left for work. I came home early that day and Twinkie was curled up on her favorite red rug and had gone to the bridge. In the entrance to my house, a houseplant that I had for years shot up a bloom for the very first time. Twinkie was an estimated seven years old when we adopted her, and she will forever be in our hearts.

FIRST-EVER COALITION OF ST. LOUIS ANIMAL WELFARE GROUPS FORMED TO MAKE ST. LOUIS ONE OF THE COUNTRY'S PETFRIENDLIEST REGIONS

ST. LOUIS, MO (June 9, 2009) – Today, St. Louis Mayor Francis Slay joined representatives from a number of area animal shelter and rescue organizations, as well as representatives from the Nestlé Purina PetCare Company, to announce a new organization aimed at promoting responsible pet ownership and increasing pet adoptions in the region: The St. Louis Petlover Coalition.

This groundbreaking initiative represents the first partnership of its kind in the St. Louis area among animal rescue groups, shelters, veterinary organizations, and City and County health departments. (See attached fact sheet for a full list of participating organizations.) Modeled after similar efforts in Denver, Austin, and New York, the St. Louis Petlover Coalition will foster collaboration among participating groups, share best practices, and help bring awareness to issues and opportunities in the region that improve animal welfare.

The members of the coalition's working group unveiled the St. Louis Petlover Coalition logo and Web site www.stlpetlover.org, today at an event in Kiener Plaza. Featured on the Web site are immediate volunteer opportunities with the participating groups.

The coalition also will work together to determine regional benchmark statistics on spay/neuter results, stray pets, return to owner rates, adoption rates, and other key measures in order to quantify the issues for the region, then work to improve them. The coalition was initially brought together by a team at the Nestlé Purina PetCare Company in February of this year. "It's wonderful that one of our best corporate citizens, Nestlé Purina, brought this diverse group together from throughout the City and County to focus on their common goal: to save more pets," said Mayor Slay.

"Collaboration is critical for the success of the region and for the well-being of pets in the St. Louis area," said St. Louis County Health Department Director, Dr. Dolores Gunn. "While each organization will maintain its individual mission and programs, to-day we stand here together as the St. Louis Petlover Coalition."

While formally announced today, participating organizations already are communicating and collaborating more, and saving more pets together. Several groups realized they shared programs to adopt more senior dogs and are working to increase this reach. Also, funds for spay/neuter are being shared more broadly to impact this critical issue. Members of the coalition even came together at the City Shelter at Gasconade last week to help the City team paint as part of its facility improvements.

<u>Unanimous Support</u> Nestlé Purina's Vice President of Animal Welfare, Betsy Cohen, said, "We had researched and spent time in other cities that have created these kinds of coalitions – Denver, Austin, New York, and others. And we saw the amazing things that happened when individual pet organizations came together to support each other and focus on their common goal: to save pets. We wanted to see if we could make this work in St. Louis, too."

After just a couple meetings, it was clear that there was unanimous support for officially forming the St. Louis Petlover Coalition. "We didn't anticipate being able to announce this for several more months," said Cohen. "But we reached consensus very quickly. Given the current economy, and with the pressing need these groups have for volunteers this summer, we felt it was imperative to announce the Coalition as soon as possible."

Cohen emphasized that Coalition participants will maintain their independence and respective missions, but will collaborate to save pets and promote responsible pet ownership.

"We applaud what the St. Louis animal community is doing," said Bob Rohde, President and CEO of the Denver Dumb Friends League. "When I was asked to speak to the working group and share the successes we've had in Denver, I was excited to help bring the idea of a coalition to life in St. Louis."
