to stay.



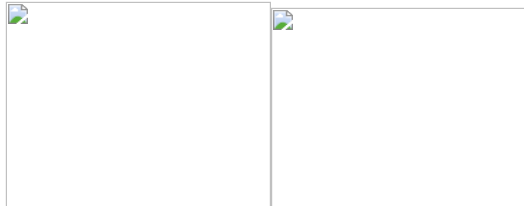
Hope

seeing how much love is in her new home for her.



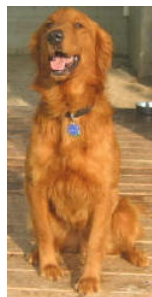
Blossom

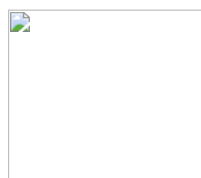
Madison aka Maddy

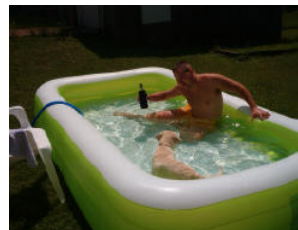
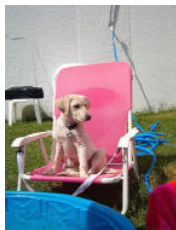


Jeff

Abbala is a sweet girl who has found a great home where she gets lots of love and attention.



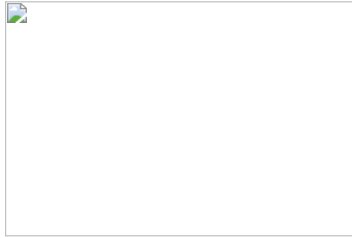
Aberdeen
